Several members of the business community met by teleconference to discuss multiple remittances. We understand that Michigan, North Carolina and Ohio will need to make legislative changes, do not dispute that fact and will support legislation when the time comes. We agreed that we will not seek any amendment in the Streamlined Agreement until each of these states has completed a regular legislative session to give each of the above states the time to change their law. We believe that the way the changes will work produce positive cash flow (float) for the states and are willing have that be the price for an election to allow retailers to make fewer payments. Given the positive fiscal note and the technical nature of these changes, it seems to us that this could be part of each of these states' department of revenue "housekeeping bill" in the next regular legislative session.

We appreciate the states working with us on this and if there are concerns going forward please let us know and we will continue to work toward a resolution.
