

Request for Governing Board approval to allow member states to require sellers registered under the Agreement to use an address-based database provided by the member state.

Pursuant to Streamlined Sales Tax Governing Board Rule 807.2.A.3, Georgia, Iowa, Kansas, Nebraska, Oklahoma, South Dakota, Tennessee, Vermont and Washington are requesting this document, MC21002, be considered for addition to the agenda and for discussion and action by the Streamlined Sales Tax Governing Board at its meeting scheduled for December 21, 2021.

Specifically, SSTGB Rule 807.2.A.3 provides:

Addition of Agenda Items. Member States wishing to add action or discussion items to the agenda may do so, if circulated in writing in advance to the membership of the Governing Board not less than 10 days prior to the meeting and with the approval of a majority of those present and voting at the meeting. A motion to add the item to the agenda must be considered by the Governing Board.

It should be noted that discussion and action on this item may not be necessary if the proposed amendments to Sections 305, 306 and 307 of the SSUTA contained in [AM21007A01](#) (and as may be further amended at the meeting), are approved.

Georgia

The State of Georgia requests the Governing Board's approval, as provided in Section 305.G., to require sellers that register under this Agreement to use the address-based database records provided by Georgia. The State of Georgia requests this approval to be effective April 1, 2022, permitting the state to cease providing liability relief for errors resulting from the reliance on the database provided under the provisions of Section 305, subsection (F), effective April 1, 2022.

Iowa

The State of Iowa requests the Governing Board's approval, as provided in Section 305.G., to require sellers that register under this Agreement to use the address-based database records provided by Iowa. The State of Iowa requests this approval to be effective April 1, 2022, permitting the state to cease providing liability relief for errors resulting from the reliance on the database provided under the provisions of Section 305, subsection (F), effective April 1, 2022.

Kansas

The State of Kansas hereby requests the Governing Board's approval, as provided in Section 305.G., to require sellers that register under this Agreement to use the address-based database records provided by Kansas. The State of Kansas requests this approval to be effective April 1, 2022, permitting the state to cease providing liability relief for errors resulting from the reliance on the database provided under the provisions of Section 305, subsection (F), effective April 1, 2022.

Nebraska

The State of Nebraska requests the Governing Board's approval, as provided in Section 305.G., to require sellers that register under this Agreement to use the address-based database records provided by Nebraska. The State of Nebraska requests this approval to be effective April 1, 2022, permitting the state to cease providing liability relief for errors resulting from the reliance on the database provided under the provisions of Section 305, subsection (F), effective April 1, 2022.

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Oklahoma

The State of Oklahoma requests the Governing Board's approval, as provided in Section 305.G., to require sellers that register under this Agreement to use the address-based database records provided by Oklahoma. The State of Oklahoma requests this approval to be effective April 1, 2022, permitting the state to cease providing liability relief for errors resulting from the reliance on the database provided under the provisions of Section 305, subsection (F), effective April 1, 2022.

South Dakota

The State of South Dakota requests the Governing Board's approval, as provided in Section 305.G., to require sellers that register under this Agreement to use the address-based database records provided by South Dakota. The State of South Dakota requests this approval to be effective April 1, 2022, permitting the state to cease providing liability relief for errors resulting from the reliance on the database provided under the provisions of Section 305, subsection (F), effective April 1, 2022.

Tennessee

The State of Tennessee requests the Governing Board's approval, as provided in Section 305.G., to require sellers that register under this Agreement to use the address-based database records provided by Tennessee. The State of Tennessee requests this approval to be effective April 1, 2022, permitting the state to cease providing liability relief for errors resulting from the reliance on the database provided under the provisions of Section 305, subsection (F), effective April 1, 2022.

Vermont

The State of Vermont requests the Governing Board's approval, as provided in Section 305.G., to require sellers that register under this Agreement to use the address-based database records provided by Vermont. The State of Vermont requests this approval to be effective April 1, 2022, permitting the state to cease providing liability relief for errors resulting from the reliance on the database provided under the provisions of Section 305, subsection (F), effective April 1, 2022.

Washington

The State of Washington requests the Governing Board's approval, as provided in Section 305.G., to require sellers that register under this Agreement to use the address-based database records provided by Washington. The State of Washington requests this approval to be effective April 1, 2022.
